There are a range of games and artwork to see at Wellington Square. You can find them on the mall.




How will I get to Wellington Square?

You can get to Wellington Square by car.

We have a car park with Blue Badge parking.

You can get to Wellington Square by bus.

We are located a one-minute walk away from many bus stops on Stockton High Street.



How will I get in to Wellington Square?

We have three entrances to Wellington Square.

You can enter from Dovecot Street, Stockton High Street or Wellington Street.



How will I find the toilets?

Our toilets are opposite Iceland. We have male, female and disabled toilets.

There is a Changing Places toilet in The Shambles on Stockton High Street, a one-minute walk away from Wellington Square.



Who might I see at Wellington Square?

During your visit you might see a range of different people.

Shoppers, Management Staff, Security and Housekeeping – all our centre staff are autism trained.



What are the normal hours?

Wellington Square is open 9am to 5.30pm, Monday to Saturday and 10am to 4pm on a Sunday.

What are the busier times?

Wellington Square is busiest on a Wednesday and a Saturday.

During school holidays, Christmas and at our events, Wellington Square can look different with more people and different activities.


What are the quiet hours?
